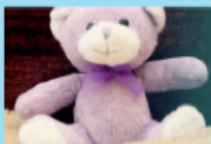
Improvise, conduct and learn new musical terms through activities like:

Musical Games

Music Games is all about singing, playing instruments and creativity. Key Stage 1 children experience musical instruments and enjoy making music. Through creative activities, the children learn to recognise musical symbols, notes of the keyboard, songs and instruments.

Mini Music

Mini Music is an introduction to musical ideas through song, playing instruments, arts & crafts, and games.



Pre-school children sing and play on tuned & untuned percussion instruments, keyboard/piano. This develops useful life skills, such as motor skills, sharing and co-ordination, and a love of music.
